POLICY GUIDELINES FOR CREDENTIALING

Education or Continuing Education Program

BCPTA reserves the right to review and reject the sponsor, content, and presenter of an education or continuing education program.

Renewal of Registration

If audited by BCPTA, you must provide transcripts from institutions of higher education or certificates from BCPTA-approved providers of Play Therapy Continuing Education (with their Approved Provider number displayed).

Application for Registration

Copies of course syllabi, registration materials, training programs, promotional Flyers, etc, may also be requested. Do not submit original copies of your certificates as all materials will be destroyed after review.

Denial, Revocation, Suspension, or Probation

Note: BCPTA is not a regulatory body.

A BCRPT or BCRPT-S registration application may be denied, or BCPTA may unilaterally revoke, suspend, or place on probation a BCRPT or BCRPT-S credentialed counsellor, for one or more of these reasons:

- a) Disciplinary action is taken against you by the registering body that results in the suspension or revocation of your registration.
- b) Complaint(s) are being made about you and/or your work.
- c) Conviction of a crime related to the provision of mental health services or a crime that would adversely affect the interests, effectiveness, reputation, or image of BCPTA.
- d) Falsification, by inclusion or omission, of information on the BCRPT and BCRPT-S application or renewal, or on any supporting document.
- e) Failure to complete BCRPT and BCRPT-S registration application or renewal requirements.
- f) Representing your BCRPT or BCRPT-S registration as your primary registration.

In case of any dispute, the applicant may appeal to the Board of BCPTA. The decision of the Board is final.

CEs provided by other institutes or presenters will be considered upon submission of the course description on an individual basis. In order for a course to be considered it must contain one or more of the following in the description: play therapy, expressive arts therapy, creative arts therapy, sand tray therapy, or sand play therapy.

 BCRPT Must complete 2000 direct hours of supervised general clinical practice. No more than 1000 hours of the above may be acquired prior to a Master's or Medical degree or as part of a master's level practicum. At least 500 of these hours must be supervised practice specific to play therapy and these 500 hours must be completed AFTER the applicant has graduated with a Master's or Medical degree. A minimum of 200 hours of play therapy practice must be completed while under the supervision of a Play Therapy Credentialed Supervisor (a supervisor who is a Registered Play Therapy Supervisor such as an RPT-S, CPT-S, or BCRPT-S). Terminology

BCPTA

For BC Registered Play Therapist (BCRPT) & BC Registered Play Therapy Supervisor (BCRPT-S)

- 1. <u>BCPTA</u> refers to the British Columbia Play Therapy Association, a professional non-profit society in the province of British Columbia.
- 2. <u>BCPTA approved providers</u> refers to those individuals, organizations and businesses that are listed below:
 - a. Any provider that has been approved as a provider for the Association for Play Therapy (APT)
 - b. Any provider that has been approved as a provider for the Canadian Association for Play Therapy (CAPT)
 - c. Other providers will be considered on an individual basis and the course description must provide one or more of the following: play therapy, expressive arts therapy, creative arts therapy, sand tray therapy or sand play therapy.
- 3. <u>**CE**</u> is the is the acronym for "continuing education" (hours earned at conferences, workshops, and other forums).
- 4. <u>Contact hours</u> refer to hours of in-person play therapy training such as at a workshop or a live webinar that requires your video on for the duration of the training and a post-test component.
- 5. <u>Non-contact hours</u> are hours of pre-recorded training online that must have a post-test component.
- 6. <u>Supervision</u> is when you meet face-to-face, over the phone or online with your supervisor to discuss your play therapy cases.
- 7. <u>Direct supervision</u> is when the supervisor either directly observes you in session or views videotape of your sessions.
- 8. <u>Individual supervision</u> involves one supervisor and one supervisee.
- 9. <u>Group supervision</u> consists of one supervisor and at least 2 but not more than 6 supervisees for BCRPT certification.
- 10. <u>Supervisors</u> have a minimum of a master's degree in counselling psychology, social work or a related field. They are clinical mental health professionals eligible to supervise and are expected to abide by the ethics of their regulatory body.
- 11. <u>Credentialed supervisor</u> has play therapy supervision certification such as BCRPT-S, CPT-S or RPT-S.
- 12. <u>Un-credentialed supervisor</u> is a master's level clinician who is serving in a supervisory capacity in the field of play therapy or counselling and is not certified as a play therapy supervisor.
- 13. <u>Institutions</u> refer to colleges and universities.
- 14. Member refers to a current member of the British Columbia Play Therapy Association.
- 15. **<u>BCRPT</u>** stands for BC Registered Play Therapist.
- 16. **<u>BCRPT-S</u>** stands for BC Registered Play Therapy Supervisor.
- 17. <u>Registering body</u> refers to organizations that register master's level counsellors such as BC Association of Clinical Counsellors (BCACC), the Canadian Counselling and Psychotherapy Association (CCPA), the British Columbia Association for Marriage and Family Therapy (BCAMFT). A registering body will be considered if it has a code of ethics and a complaint/disciplinary process.
