PRIMARY REGISTRATION

BCRPT	BCRPT-S
 Applicant must show that s/he is a member in good standing with a College or a BCPTA approved registering body 	
 For example: Registered Clinical Counsellor, Canadian Certified Counsellor, Registered Social Worker, or Registered Psychologist 	
 BCRPT is a secondary designation only effective when the applicant holds a primary registration renewed annually 	 BCRPT-S is a secondary designation only effective when the applicant holds a primary registration renewed annually

SUPERVISOR TRAINING

BCRPT	BCRPT-S
	Obtain a minimum of 12 hours of supervisor training
	 This training can relate to the general practice of providing effective/ethical clinical supervision
	 A minimum of 2 of these supervisor training hours must be on the provision of Play Therapy-specific supervision

CLINICAL EXPERIENCE

BCRPT	BCRPT-S
 Must complete 2000 direct hours of supervised general clinical practice 	
• No more than more than 1000 hours of the above may be acquired prior to a	
Master's or Medical degree	
• At least 500 of these hours must be supervised practice specific to play therapy and	
these 500 hours must be completed AFTER the applicant has graduated with a	
Master's or Medical degree A minimum of 200 hours needs to be supervised by a Play Therapy 	
Credentialed Supervisor (BCRPT-S, RPT-S, CPT-S)	
• Up to 300 of these hours may be	supervised by a non-credentialed supervisor

SUPERVISION OF PLAY THERAPY

BCRPT	BCRPT-S
 Must have 50 hours of play therapy specific supervision A minimum of 10 hours needs to be direct supervision one on one (=direct observation or 	
 videotape) by a credentialed supervisor Op to 20 hours can be group supervision run by a credentialed supervisor with the group being no larger than 6 	
 A minimum of 10 hours of supervision must be by the same credentialed supervisor 	
 Up to 30 hours of supervision can be provided by an un- credentialed supervisor 	

SUPERVISION OF SUPERVISION

	 8 hours of direct supervision of supervision (in session or video tapes) by a credentialed supervisor This supervision may include a combination of individual or group (2-10 individuals per group) supervision and must be conducted by a credentialed supervisor

REFERENCES

BCRPT	BCRPT-S
 A maximum of 2 reference forms are required: If the applicant had a single credentialed supervisor for all 50 supervision hours, only 1 reference form is needed If the applicant had more than one supervisor, a minimum of 1 reference form is needed from the credentialed supervisor 	 3 reference forms are required: One reference form from the credentialed supervisor who provided the supervision of supervision 2 reference forms from supervisees
 The referee fills in the reference form and mails it in. Reference forms are not to be returned in the applicant's package. 	

BCPTA MEMBERSHIP

BCRPT	BCRPT-S
 Must be a member-in-good-standing with BCPTA or become a member of BCPTA 	 Must be a member-in-good-standing with BCPTA

RENEWAL CRITERIA (3-YEAR CYCLE)

BCRPT	BCRPT-S
 24 hours of play therapy-specific continuing education as a learner or an instructor/presenter from *BCPTA approved providers 	
 Authoring a play therapy publication will be considered for up to 12 of the 24 hours. Contact the committee for details. 	
• For each of those 3 years, the applicant must show proof of having been a member in	
good standing of a College or BCPTA-approved registering body

Terminology For BC Registered Play Therapist (BCRPT) & BC Registered Play Therapist Supervisor (BCRPT-S)

- 1. <u>BCPTA</u> refers to the British Columbia Play Therapy Association, a professional non-profit society in the province of British Columbia
- 2. <u>*BCPTA-Approved Providers</u> refers to those individuals, organizations and businesses that are listed below:
 - a. Any provider that has been approved as a provider for the Association for Play Therapy (APT)
 - b. Any provider that has been approved as a provider for the Canadian Association of Child Play Therapists (CACPT)
 - c. Other providers will be considered on an individual basis and the course description must provide one or more of the following: play therapy, expressive arts therapy, creative arts therapy, sand tray therapy or sandplay therapy.
- 3. <u>CE</u> is the is the acronym for "continuing education" (hours earned at conferences, workshops, and other forums). This refers to continuing education where "students enjoy in-person (contact) or distance interaction with a live instructor in real time".

<u>Contact hours</u> refer to hours of in-person play therapy training such as at a workshop or conference

- 4. Non-contact hours are hours of training online such as in webinars
- 5. <u>Supervision</u> is when you meet face-to-face, over the phone or online with your supervisor to discuss your play therapy cases
- 6. <u>Direct Supervision</u> is when the supervisor either directly observes you in session or views videotape of your sessions
- 7. Individual Supervision involves one supervisor and one supervisee
- 8. <u>Group Supervision</u> consists of one supervisor and at least two but not more than 6 supervisees for BCRPT credentialing
- 9. <u>Supervisors</u> have minimum of a Master's degree in Counselling Psychology, Social Work or a related field. They are clinical mental health professionals eligible to supervise and are expected to abide by the ethics and stands of their regulatory body.
- 10. <u>Credentialed Supervisor</u> has play therapy supervision credentialing such as BCRPT-S, CPT-S or RPT-S
- 11. <u>Un-credentialed Supervisor</u> is a master's level clinician who is serving in a supervisory capacity in the field of Play Therapy or Counselling and is not registered as a play therapy supervisor
- 12. Institutions refer to colleges and universities
- 13. <u>Member</u> refers to a current member of the British Columbia Play Therapy Association
- 14. **<u>BCRPT</u>** stands for BC Registered Play Therapist
- 15. <u>BCRPT-S</u> stands for BC Registered Play Therapist-Supervisor
- 16. <u>Registering body</u> refers to organizations that register master's level counsellors such as BC Association of Clinical Counsellors (BCACC), the Canadian Counselling and Psychotherapy Association (CCPA), the British Columbia Association for Marriage and Family Therapy (BCAMFT)



Reflection Paper Criteria For BC Registered Play Therapist (BCRPT) & BC Registered Play Therapist Supervisor (BCRPT-S)

- A brief summary of the workshop content
- 3 things that the presenter explained that resonated with the participant
- How the participant intends to apply those 3 things in their own work in a clinical setting
- One thing that the presenter discussed that the participant disagreed with, had reservations about, or would only apply in limited circumstances. Please give details.
